OUR "NEW APPROACH": Have you noticed that the improvement program is well underway on the entrance to Pimmit Drive at Leesburg Pike? June Henry, our Housing and Gardening Committee chairman, is doing a splendid job. Contributions to date total \$312, a fine response in behalf of all contributors. A contract for the landscaping has been signed and we are hoping for completion in about three weeks.

We are especially grateful to Mrs. Henry and the children and mothers who assisted in collecting the contributions, and we are completely overwhelmed by the enthusiastic reaction of Mr. O. T. Michel, Fairfax resident engineer, who is arranging to supplement our plantings with rambler roses on the grade above the entrance, in addition to grading the slopes.

POLIO DRIVE: Pimmit Hills response to the Mother's March on Polio was most gratifying, contributions amounting to \$560. Orchids to Nan Netherton, who handled arrangements, and the kind Marchers.

FAIRFAX C.A.'s FEDERATION: At a meeting Thursday night the county Federation of Citizens' Associations approved a redistricting of Fairfax County to provide seven magisterial voting districts in place of the present six.

Roger McLeod and Marvin Erlendson represented the Pimmit Hills C.A. at the meeting approving the plan calling for six districts to share urban and rural populations and a seventh district which would be entirely rural. According to the proposed plan Pimmit Hills would be located in a new Dranesville district.
