The Nominating Committee, appointed at the March meeting, has reported to the Executive Committee the following list of candidates:

President - Charles Lewis, 400 Leonard Road  
Mr. Lewis has been a resident of Pimmit Hills and a member of the Association since February, 1955, having come to Virginia from New York State. He has 2 children and is employed as a Geologist with the U.S. Geological Survey. He has served as District Representative from his District, and, for a period, as Acting Chairman of the District Representatives. In the past year he assisted in the investigatory work for curbs and gutters, served on the Redistricting Committee and has been an active participant in the Paper Drives.

Vice President - Floyd Flasher, 2112 Pimmit Drive  
Mr. Flasher was one of the earlier residents of Section 7. He immediately demonstrated interest in the Citizens' Association and worked to increase the membership from that new section. Through serving as a District Representative, he has become acquainted with and interested in the problems and aims of the Pimmit Hills Community. Mr. Flasher was born in Philadelphia, Penn. and attended schools near Pittsburgh. He has two children and is employed by the Department of Air Force.

Treasurer - Boris Mandrovsky, 2306 Verdlie Place

Mr. Mandrovsky has been a resident of Pimmit Hills and a member of the Citizens' Association since October, 1952. For the past year he has served the community as Chairman of the District Representatives and ex officio member of the Executive Committee, and Chairman of the Paper-Drive. Mr. Mandrovsky was raised in Connecticut. He is a graduate of George Washington University and Georgetown School of Foreign Service.
